Nebraska Manufacturing Facts

Manufacturers in Nebraska account for 12.7 percent of the total output in the state, employing 9.8 percent of the workforce. Total output from manufacturing was \$14.0 billion in 2013. In addition, there were 96,100 manufacturing employees in Nebraska, with an average annual compensation of \$58,333 in 2013.

Figure 1: Nebraska Manufacturing Output, in Billions of Dollars, 2000–2013





Figure 2: Top 10 Nebraska Manufacturing Sectors, in Millions of Dollars, 2012




Nebraska Export Facts

Manufacturers help to drive Nebraska's economy, with \$6.2 billion in manufactured goods exports in 2013. That same year, \$3.0 billion in exports was with our free trade agreement (FTA) partners. This helps create jobs in the state, and 15.9 percent of its employment stemmed from exports in 2011. Small businesses comprised 82.1 percent of all exporters in Nebraska.

 partners than we bought from them. The United States has a manufactured trade deficit of \$508 billion from
 countries where no FTAs existed.
